Alternative Transportation Services

Program Funding: \$52,800

Family Housing Stability

Program Funding: \$164,500

Keeps families at-risk of becoming homeless out of the shelter system by providing case management, housing locator, financial and other assistance that moves them from housing- instability to finding and securing a suitable and affordable apartment.

HIRE Housing

Program Funding: \$50,000

Assists HIRE participants to sustain or find affordable housing so they may concentrate on achieving their employment goals.

Housing Counseling

Program Funding: \$15,125

Provides emergency shelter and trauma informed, culturally inclusive case management to homeless families with children.

Rapid Rehousing

Program Funding: \$338,025

Provides rent assistance and professional case management to stably house families experiencing homelessness.

Steps to Stability

Program Funding: \$13,860
